

MetroWest Boston offers a wealth of arts and culture. We recommend the following:

Danforth Art Museum (Framingham, MA)

A jewel box housed in the historic Jonathan Maynard Building. Browse the 3,500+ pieces in their permanent collection reflecting works of art from the 18th century to today, including the largest collection of work and ephemera by Harlem Renaissance sculptor Meta Vaux Warrick Fuller. The Museum offers seasonal exhibitions, art workshops, and special programs and events.





"Many Cultures, One Heart" public art project (Framingham, MA)

The hearts represent the diversity of Framingham, and include work by artists of many races, religions, ethnicities, and nationalities. Each heart includes a plaque with a QR code that links to an artist's video telling their personal stories. One heart represents Brazilian immigrants in Framingham, the largest population of Brazilians outside of Brazil, one tells the Indigenous story of Massachusetts, another includes the word "Welcome" in all 67 languages spoken in Framingham, and more. Go on a scavenger hunt to find as many as you can.

Hopkinton Center for the Arts (Hopkinton, MA)

One of the region's largest performing and visual arts centers, HCA includes a rotating gallery of regional work, a wealth of art workshops and special events, engaging lectures and educational programs, and indoor and outdoor performances, such as their famous "A Play, A Pint & A Pie" summer stock production of one act plays submitted from all over the world. With your ticket price comes a pint of local craft beer and a savory hand pie. HCA is always happy to create a custom class or book a private performance for your group.





Claflin Hill Symphony Orchestra (Milford, MA)

Enjoy a symphony, chamber music, or jazz concert during the season, including their famous Holiday Pops concert. In the summer, bring a picnic and enjoy their free outdoor family concerts. Alternatively, see what other classical music MetroWest Symphony Orchestra might have on offer.

The Districts' lovely boutiques showcase local handcrafted items. Natick offers weekly Natick Nights arts events in the summer, and Marlborough's Museum in the Streets is a unique walking tour of the town.

Dean College Performing Arts Season (Franklin, MA)

Dean College's nationally-ranked performing arts department has something for everyone, from award-winning musicals to cutting-edge plays to innovative dance performances. Running Oct to May, the season includes four theatre, four dance, and multiple showcase performances featuring Dean's students and renowned guests.





The Center for Arts in Natick (Natick, MA)

Housed in a restored 1875 fire station, the theater brings in both national and local acts, from plays to live music to comedians to movie screenings.

The Black Box (Franklin, MA)

This small theater has built up quite a reputation for showcasing Broadway acts, as well as its own company's plays, musical theater, dance, and musical performances.
