# Natick Mall (Natick, MA)

The largest mall in New England showcases both luxury brands like Louis Vuitton and Tory Burch as well as amazing activities—from Bosse's 21 indoor pickleball courts to Level99's 50+ mental and physical escape rooms and challenges to Puttshack's high-tech mini golf, there is something for everyone. Next door is another large shopping center as well as a movie theater to keep everyone entertained.

# Patriot Place (Foxborough, MA)

Next door to Gillette Stadium, home of the New England Patriots, Patriot Place has a wealth of shops—from an art gallery displaying local artwork to favorite American brands—as well as restaurants, a brewery, movie theater, and a variety of activities including axe throwing, a comedy club, paint bar, escape room, seasonal ice skating rink, and more. Don't miss The Patriots Hall of Fame interactive museum or the Gillette Stadium Lighthouse, which stands 22 stories and offers 360 degree views of the surrounding area, including the Boston and Providence skylines!

The various Districts' lovely boutiques showcase clothing, home décor, jewelry, artisanal foods, and local handcrafted items. Each walkable District also offers a plethora of public art, restaurants, theaters, and artists' studios, plus a huge variety of special events, including fairs and festivals, open studio nights, live concerts, and more. Many of these events include regional vendors. Each makes for a great day out with a group, ending with a theater show at The Center for Arts (Natick) or The Black Box (Franklin), or with a flight and live entertainment at Lost Shoe Brewing (Marlborough).

## Hudson, MA

Explore lively downtown Hudson, winner of America's Best Main Street in 2021. Enjoy a variety of restaurants, cafes, and breweries for a quick snack or leisurely meal, then wander the boutiques filled with small-batch beauty products, handcrafted home décor, stationery, books, and trendy clothing. Make sure to visit the shops of The Landing, where you can discover everything from handmade jewelry, vintage consignment, and pottery to delicious artisanal foods and locally sourced products—great for unique souvenirs or gifts. The town also puts on a number of festivals and fairs each year, complete with live entertainment and shopping from local vendors.





### Holliston, MA

Another charming New England town, Holliston offers a variety of shops, from an old-fashioned general store, to collaborative boutiques, as well as cafes, restaurants, working artists studios, and a variety of special events. The town also has the Upper Charles Rail Trail running through it, making for a great opportunity to combine a beautiful walk with a little shopping. On one end of town lies Boston Honey Company, a family-owned honey farm with a lovely shop stocked full of locally-made products. Browse honey-based soaps, lotions, and other bath essentials. Watch them create beautiful beeswax candles and be sure to visit their honey bar to try different local honey flavors (you'll be amazed at the variations between them!).
